

Home Fire & Life Safety Checklist

Preventing fires and injuries requires homework. Take about 20 minutes to inspect your home. As you go from room to room, answer the questions below by coloring in the circle next to the correct answer. Kids, ask a grown-up to help you complete the checklist!

		Cooking Safety
Yes	○ No	Does a grown-up always stay in the kitchen when food is cooking on the stove?
Yes	○ No	Are stove tops and nearby counter spaces clean and free of things that can burn?
Yes	○ No	Is there a "kid-free" zone of three feet around the stove when grown-ups are cooking?
		Heating Safety
Yes	○ No	If space heaters are used, are they at least three away from things that can burn including people, furniture and pets?
Yes	○ No	If your home has a chimney, has it been inspected and cleaned in the past year?
Yes	○ No	Has your furnace been serviced by a professional in the past year?
Yes	O No	Are propane tanks and other fuels stored outside your home?
		Electrical Safety
Yes	○ No	Are electrical cords in good condition, without cracks or frayed areas? (Grown-ups should help with this inspection)
Yes	○ No	Are kitchen appliances such as the coffee maker, toaster oven and microwave plugged into separate outlets?
		Smoke Alarms/Home Fire Escape Plan
Yes	○ No	Does your home have smoke alarms in each sleeping room, outside each sleeping area and on every level of your home?
Yes	○ No	Have the batteries in smoke alarms been replaced in the last year? (A grown-up should help you press the test button)
Yes	○ No	Does your family have a home escape plan that includes two exits from every room?
Yes	○ No	In the last six months, has your family practiced your home escape plan which includes a safe meeting place outside?
Yes	O No	Would your family like the Riverside Fire Authority to visit your home to discuss or assist with anything on this checklist? (Where needed, we will install new smoke alarms free of charge)

		Candle Safety
Yes	O No	If candles are used, are they clear of combustible material and secure in sturdy bases?
		Smoking Safety
Yes	O No	If someone smokes in your home, they never smoke in bed?
Yes	O No	Smoking materials are carefully discarded in containers that will not burn?
		Match/Lighter Safety
Yes	O No	Matches and lighters are carefully stored out of the reach of young children?
		Reporting Emergencies
